South Africa: Old Head On Young Shoulders October 31, 2013

Pick today's top performers in South Africa and the startling fact is that just a small number existed a decade ago, notwithstanding that some of its most propitious patches of "dirt" had never even been acquainted with vitis vinifera back then. There is a steady incoming tide of young and ambitious winemakers who have been inspired by tenets of the Old World and are now applying them to their homeland: winemakers armed with fortitude, dynamism, open-mindedness and a surf board tucked under their arm, determined to force the country into the 21st century. I use that word "force" because a combination of entrenched and outmoded practices, large corporations intent on quantity not quality, and blinkered and sloppy winemakers all remain. But against this backdrop, as I remarked in my previous report, South Africa is the most exciting country in the southern hemisphere.

Many consumers are yet to cotton to that fact. This means that the time to start discovering South African wine is not tomorrow, but today.

Growing Seasons: 2010-2012

I am grateful to Wines of South Africa for sending me VINPRO's growing season reports that I have summarized.

After the benevolent 2009 vintage, **2010** saw all matter of obstacles thrown in front of winemakers. September saw below average temperatures while the subsequent two months witnessed strong gales. Some microclimates, such as Voor-Paardeberg, where the mountains offer natural protection, were less affected, but there were outbreaks of hail in Stellenbosch towards the end of October where rainfall was four times higher than average in November. This impacted upon flowering and caused outbreaks of downy mildew. December was then extremely dry and the heat wave caused some vines to shut down until the end of February. In some areas the heat wave stuck around until March, manifesting sunburn and shriveled berries. In Swartland, the harvest was approximately 20% below that of 2009 mainly due to down mildew that affected old Chenin blocks in particular. In Constantia, yields were reduced by 25-50%.

The **2011** vintage was a turbulent one that tested many winemakers, marked by a late winter with cold spells toward the end of May and beginning of June. Winter rainfall was below average and the growing season commenced under cool conditions and was quite overcast. Inclemency during flowering caused uneven fruit set, especially in those varieties with later bud burst. November was very dry and January extremely hot, necessitating careful irrigation of vineyards. Sporadic thunderstorms also threatened the outbreak of rot. VINPRO notes that several grape varieties reached maturity simultaneously, which placed stress upon both managing the harvest and fermenting the fruit once it had been transferred into the winery.



Of course, there are significant variations from region to region. Malmesbury suffered slow ripening due to the low water levels in the soils and the temperature during the crush was about 35 degrees Celsius. Paarl and Robertson also faced an extremely challenging growing season due to the heat and drought, causing sunburn and shriveled berries. Stellenbosch saw the windiest December in 42 years, followed by a heat wave that dragged on to February and March. Down in Hemel-en-Aarde, rainfall and humidity combined to cause problems with rot that affected the Sauvignon Blanc and Pinot Noir.

The **2012** vintage saw cold and rainy conditions afflict the second part of flowering. This resulted in uneven fruit set with a great deal of pressure from disease (for example, downy mildew around Paarl.) Fortunately, December was less windy than usual but again, January was abnormally hot and predicated outbreaks of sunburn and hydric stress in dry-farmed vineyards. Cooler conditions in February and March retarded the ripening cycle and dryness inhibited outbreak of disease. Many regions saw a decrease in quantity, for example, Malmesbury down by 15-20% with respect to white grape varieties, though the reds remained around average. Analysis of grapes suggests slightly lower acid levels and higher levels of pH with good ripeness levels reached via lower sugar levels.

New Land, New Vines, New Faces

The South African panorama continues to excite. I am not the first and nor will I be the last commentator to regale the wines of South Africa, though that does not necessarily mean that oenophiles are flocking to their nearest wine shop demanding their allocation of *Méthode Cap Classique* or Grand Cru busting Hemel-en-Aarde Pinot. As I view the scene, South Africa is in a transitional stage where the number of exciting new growers is proliferating. This places a germ of interest in the minds of consumers hitherto unacquainted or even prejudiced against its wines and it takes years, not months, for that to be translated into sizeable, stable sales across the globe. But the good news is that the wines of its elite producers are now being treated seriously as world-class wines, including by those hitherto cynical about South Africa. You might include me in that group. After the first free elections in 1994 that opened South African wines to the world for the first time in decades, South Africa rushed headlong into making what were predominantly international wines that followed the recipe of plenty of oak and relatively high alcohol levels. Their flagship indigenous grape variety was Pinotage and all that was needed was for producers to go out and market their wares.

What has taken place in the last four or five years is a wholesale re-evaluation of that strategy. It has been inspired by the new generation of winemakers seeking more balanced and pure wines unafraid of elegance and infusing that into the ripeness and opulence South Africa can bring. It has also been inspired by the realization that South Africa has pockets of ancient, dry-farmed bush vines that would be best served by a conscientious winemaker desiring to express the unique *terroir* instead of being blended into anonymity by a large co-operative.

Old Vines: A Sense of Place

I spoke to Andre Morgenzon, the head of the organizational body "Wines of South Africa" on this very matter. He was clearly excited by the prospect of South Africa uncovering pockets of old vines, in particular more esoteric varieties such as Palomino. He cited Rosa Kruger and Eben Sadie as spearheading



the movement: documenting the location and minutiae of these parcels that farmers are either blissfully unaware of, or often perceive as a struggling old block of vines that are a nuisance and therefore are consigned to their local co-operative. The process of parsing these parcels away from standard vineyards, the "hoi polloi" if you like, and affording them the T.L.C. they deserve, is a two-way process with Rosa Kruger often acting as an intermediary.

I spoke to Rosa about her crusade to rescue South Africa's trove of old vines. Surely there is a finite number of ancient *vitis vinifera* and Bruce Jack has suggested that the country could be running out of new parcels to exploit.

Not at all.

Rosa explained that she has identified approximately 600 plots of old vine material, that is to say, over 40 years in age, that cover about 1,500 hectares and that she has only investigated the first 100! This only accounts for registered sites - who knows what lies out there.

"Two weeks ago I came across a parcel of old vines only about 5 minutes from the centre of town that was 114 years old. Nobody knew about. It was not even on the land register."

I asked Rosa about the constitution of these old parcels. She informed me that they tend to belong to cooperatives who are usually unaware of their age and of course, once they find out, they can become uncooperative (if you can excuse the pun) not wishing to relinquish their newfound asset to another party. They tend to exist in remote areas as separate parcels rather than part of a larger one. Rosa has noticed common features: high density planting around 1.4 meters apart, which is much smaller than many South African vineyards. They tend to be bush or goblet vines that are dry-farmed and around half are on their own roots.

What are the oldest vines she has discovered?

"1887," she replied. "And they were fully productive vines."

The grape varieties tend to be Semillon, Semillon Gris, Chenin Blanc and Palomino for white, Cinsault and Grenache for red.

So far so good. But how do they influence the vine and the wine in your glass?

Rosa believes that old vines build up a natural tolerance to South Africa's hot climate and can override climactic stress, maintaining natural acidity, attaining more depth and structure as well as precision. "They tend to override the cultivar and give wines a sense of place," she told me. "They do not taste like they have been produced in a factory. They create diversity - you could almost say they are eccentric wines." Rosa went on to cite another human factor precipitated by the parcels of old vine.

"It is important to keep farmers on the land," she continued. "If we can give them more money for their fruit then this will do that. It also benefits the farmworkers. I have also found that it brings young and old



together. You have these old guys who have been working their vines for years. They intuitively know their vines. Then you have young winemakers coming into contact with them and creating the wines."

Finally, I asked whether such wines should improve blends or be separated on their own. She was adamant that the latter is the only way, in order to express: one site, one farmer, one winemaker. Together, they are lending South Africa a newfound diversity and of course, newfound potential. Readers should look for Eben Sadie's "Old Vine Series" or Chris Alheit's "Radio Lazarus" to taste what this all means in bottle.

Coupled with this quest for old vine movement is a replanting program that is much more considered than in the past, not only reconciling varieties to domestic and international demand, but by site specifics and most appropriate clones via-à-vis soil type and microclimate. This may have burdened South Africa with a surfeit of young vine material. However, the consensus speaking to many growers is that clonal material is now far better, and crucially, virus-free. It means the long-term prospects are more assured and exciting as those healthy vines reach maturity en masse.

Of course, it is not just the elite wines that must strive for quality, but also the entry-level wines that occupy supermarket shelves, a conduit for consumers to learn more about South African wine. In the past this has been South Africa's Achilles heel. Whereas Australia built a successful wine industry founded on their ubiquitous, cheap and reliable brand names, South Africa's offerings did not match up. But that is changing.

"The big boys understand that they have to 'sexy up' the entry-level wines," opined Andre Morgenzon. "It's a very competitive side [of the industry.] South African wineries have not been competitive. We don't have the economies of scale. But I think, as just two examples, The Mentors range for KWV or the Bernard Series from DGB have changed perception and there is a new mentality of making wine better. It took more than a decade to realize that you cannot just bottle anything and think it is going sell. Now they are proper winemakers creating and blending those wines."

What could possibly stymie this potential? Unfortunately, and somewhat predictably it is the government. Many growers and promotional bodies lamented the attitude of the South African government as indifferent at best, damaging at worst. Wine is perceived as a luxury niche and luxury niches do not merit financial or even positive rhetoric when poverty is so widespread. In post-apartheid South Africa, proprietors of wine estates are nearly all white, and therefore there is a political angle, a misguided view that wine is a totem of the past, rather than a means of integration for the future. As I see it, the only way to change this is for more of its middle-class black population to discover the pleasures of wine and this is beginning to happen because wine never recognizes someone's color of skin.

As can be gleaned from my synopsis of recent vintages, the growers faced many challenges, not least the tendency for January to suffer prolonged heat waves that cause sunburn and berry shrivel, and accumulate sugars before the berries achieve physiological ripeness. This is not an easy problem to tackle and perhaps South Africa needs to entice more gifted vineyard managers to their shores and enable vines to withstand such conditions through better clonal selection, careful pruning and even organic/biodynamic solutions. One meteorological factor rarely mentioned are the strong Atlantic winds that can deplete potential crops during flowering and damage vines. Winemaker Bruce Jack cited wind as a major problem in South



Africa and presented one startling fact that a vine spends 50% of its energy simply remaining upright, which obviously diverts energy away from fruit formation.

Moving into the winery, there is definitely a growing trend for a reduction in the percentage of new oak. That is not to say that it is being eradicated entirely, but rather there is more consideration about the proportion vis-à-vis the fruit concentration and expanding experimentation with alternative vessels such as oak foudres. I heard the same message repeated time and time again, especially with younger winemakers and noteably those whose wines have been lauded from several quarters. There is a place for new oak, including 100% new oak in South Africa, but too often it tends to overload the wine and render it rather generic.

South Africa by Grape Variety

South Africa continues to pursue a diverse array of wines. I will start with the one synonymous with the country: **Pinotage**, which continues its dramatic improvement in recent years (this from someone that would run away screaming from Pinotage ten years ago.) Some argue, rather glibly I might add, that this amelioration is due to Pinotage disowning the common traits that have traditionally defined this hybrid grape variety. More accurately, it is more a case of addressing the problems that afflicted sub-standard Pinotage in the past, that horrible tendency to be overladen with excessively sweet ripe fruit while remaining jarringly green in the mouth. For sure, that "burnt rubber" sensation that plagued many wines has dramatically fallen, if not been completely eradicated. Bruce Jack puts it down to an improvement in vineyard practices, specifically obtaining phenological ripeness in berries coupled with less "sloppy" vinification. The new streamlined, 21st century Pinotages have eliminated those "green nasties" and offer almost Southern Rhône-like flavors with plenty of fruit, without dispensing with balance. One should also remember that Pinotage has an amazing propensity to age, as evinced by the Lanzerac bottling that I have tasted myself. Granted, convincing people to cellar bottles is easier said than done!

Perhaps the one weak spot remains **Bordeaux blends**, which was the most disappointing flight of my tasting sessions. They seemed like an anachronism of South African viticulture, trying desperately to mimic Bordeaux by misguidedly drowning over-ripe fruit in plenty of oak, as if reading from a recipe that will guarantee success. Fortunately, the tendency for such styles is diminishing, albeit at a slow pace. Winemakers need to start thinking about letting the fruit express itself with complementary oak rather than domineering. Within this category, I feel that Bordeaux blends are still searching for their own voice, their sense of authenticity now and beyond. On a more optimistic note, Gary Jordan commented how both the Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot clones have improved. Where South Africa once relied predominantly upon Italian clones, the introduction of new clones such as "343" and "348" during the 1990s should result in significantly improved fruit as those vines reach maturity in the not too distant future. He told me that these new clones have impacted upon the quality of vines, with more regular leaf canopies, and more upright vines that he described as being less "floppy" than the Italian clones, with brighter and more complex berries.

Stellenbosch remains the mainstay of Bordeaux blends and Gary Jordan opined that the rise of Swartland and the international attention that has been bestowed on its top growers, awoke the Stellenbosch growers from their somewhat hidebound ways. He sees the revolution in Swartland as migrating to Stellenbosch



and this should ultimately be reflected in the quality of Bordeaux blends. "Wineries have no choice," he told me. "They have to change." Change they surely will, but at the moment the Rhône blends are streets ahead.

I have said it before and I will say it again: **Rhône blends** are perhaps South Africa's strongest card. Wake up, those who think great Syrah only comes from the hill in Hermitage or California, because their South African counterparts have meliorated dramatically in the last decade, to the point where the price tags can be misleading. What I admire about this category is that many of the wines have quietly attained a sense of authenticity, a notion of what they ought to be.

Why is this the case?

Simply because the exponents of Rhône varietals that mainly come from Swartland are obsessive about quality, quality and quality. These are producers who think nothing of going to extreme lengths to seek out the best terroirs, to persevere out there in the vineyard, nurturing their vines like babies (often, but not necessarily, through biodynamic techniques) and considering very carefully the optimal means of vinification and maturation.

Pinot Noir is another grape variety that is making great headway in South Africa. There seem to be fewer ham-fisted examples whereby the winemaker has tried to extract as much as possible from what is a sensitive grape that needs to be treated with care. Without doubt two of the regions where Pinot Noir can thrive are Hemel-en-Aarde and Elgin.

"As a category for South Africa it is early days for Pinot Noir and styles vary significantly," commented Anthony Hamilton Russell. "The work we, as a growers' association, are doing with the three appellations in the Hemel-en-Aarde area will produce a much clearer stylistic identity for South African Pinot Noir over the coming few years. This to me is definitely an area of great potential for Pinot Noir and we would have failed if we cannot articulate the styles of the three appellations more clearly in an international context."

You have to put Pinot Noir in perspective. It still represents only around 1% of plantings and some of that will end up as a sparkling wine. But as Hamilton Russell remarked, there is a clear idea coalescing in winemakers' minds of what South African Pinot should be, and when they get it right, it can rank alongside and surpass a lot of Burgundy and at half the price (and I am tasting a lot of Burgundy these days.) So although I cannot envisage this fickle variety becoming a major player like Chenin Blanc or Syrah, its finest examples will play an important ambassadorial role in persuading the outside world that South Africa is a country that can produce world-class wine from the most challenging of grape varieties.

With respect to white varieties, there are many that believe that South Africa's finest wines are the likes of Chardonnay, Sauvignon Blanc and of course, Chenin Blanc. They have a strong case to put forward because there are now plenty of growers regularly producing superb examples of each. The flight of **Chardonnay** wines was impressive, demonstrating astute use of oak that ensured that most were crisp and well-balanced with plenty of flavor. At the moment, the source of top quality Chardonnay seems more producer-driven than regional, perhaps a sign that to bottle a good Chardonnay is easy, but to produce



great Chardonnay demands a great winemaker such as Goffried Mocke at Chamonix (Franschhoek), Peter-Allan Finlayson at Crystallum, Hannes Storm at Hamilton Russell (both in Hemel-en-Aarde) or Miles Mossop at Tokara (Stellenbosch) to name but a few. I could not find a type of vinification that suited South African Chardonnay, with good and bad examples of barrel-fermented/tank-fermented, leesstirred and non-lees stirred wines on display. Again, I put that down to the winemaker who makes that crucial decision. Certainly the cooler microclimates to be found in Hemel-en-Aarde and increasingly in Constantia may give them an advantage, but then again there are so many fine examples from Franschhoek and Stellenbosch.

Chenin Blanc, or to give it its local name "Steen", has huge potential in South Africa as more and more growers realize that instead of using it to churn out large volumes of white wine, marrying it with the right *terroir* and exploiting the trove of old bush vine material, this should be the country's signature grape variety. It continues to be the country's most planted, representing around 30% of all white wines. In has been difficult to change perceptions in the United States, where Chenin Blanc is still associated with jug wines, though that is not the case in emerging markets such as China and India that have embraced it with open arms. Gary Jordan suggested that a combination of factors is resulting in a revolution in top South African Chenin: vine age, more assiduous lees-aging and occasionally prudent skin contact in order to impart more phenolics into the wines. One could argue that the variety reaches its apotheosis with Eben Sadie's "Palladius," from 60-year-old bush vines, as well as his Old Vine Series of releases. Sadie's almost monomaniacal crusade to discover and save precious plots of old vine and vinify them as naturally as possible has already yielded a clutch of spellbinding wines that push the envelope. Granted, they might not be to everyone's taste as I spelled out in my last report, but they can foment ideas in fellow winemakers' heads, demonstrate what is possible. For sure, what Chenin Blanc lacks is the commercial familiarity of Chardonnay and consumers are more likely to choose something that they recognize. Therefore, I agree with writer Tim James that Chardonnay has the largest contribution to make towards white varieties. But Chardonnay does not have the enigma; that unknown element that marks out a Chenin Blanc meticulously picked from ancient vines. I am intrigued to see how they will age.

Where once tasting South African **Sauvignon Blanc** seemed like a punishment for some misdemeanor in a previous life, now it is something I positively look forward to. This is one area where I can see growers homing in on their identity, stylistically reminiscent of a fine Marlborough "Savvy," combining zesty citrus fruit with subtle tropical notes and eschewing the pyrazine element that can put off so many (although personally I quite enjoy it in modest doses.) The quality level is much more consistent than in previous years, and fine examples can be found especially from the Cape. For example, Cape Point Vineyards where Duncan Savage is on a roll, also at Klein Constantia and Iona in Elgin.

The sweet wine category has great potential in South Africa, although it will always remain a niche market however exemplary the wines are. The likes of Chris Mullineux and Miles Mossop are creating world-class grape-shrivelled and botrytis-affected sweet wines. Here, South Africa has a great advantage, because Chenin Blanc has proven to be so adept at harnessing pure botrytis formation.

Before moving on, I mentioned that word apropos Bordeaux - blend. The art of blending is a mysterious one and must be learned through trial and error. In last year's report, I expressed my desire to see Argentina expanding its horizons through more emphasis on blending and it is the same for South Africa.



Once you perfect the monovarietal, it is time to tinker with the formula because the sum can be greater than the parts. Just look at the success of Rhône blends coming out of Swartland. Now I am finding intriguing blends of Chenin Blanc and Semillon and Bordeaux blends with Pinotage. The flipside is that you can go too far. Too often I found everything but the kitchen sink thrown into the vat and consequently the nuances of each variety are cancelled out. It is like two rock bands simultaneously playing as loud as they possibly can. The result is a cacophony, not sweet music.

Of course, the spectre lurking behind all this optimism is leafroll virus. When I first visited Vergelegen, winemaker André van Rensberg was adamant that the only means of curing a vineyard was uprooting all affected vines and replacing them with non-virused stock. Gary Jordan remarked that this draconian policy is now regarded as a bitter pill to swallow if you really want to remedy the louse infestation. But of course, it is limited only to those that are serious about their wines and can afford it. It is futile uprooting vines and re-planting the next spring, since the louse can remain dormant in the ground and reappear the following year. Therefore, the ground must lie fallow for three years. Fortunately, there are now more ecologically friendly sprays that kill just the vine rather than extirpating all forms of life. Once the vines are re-planted, then the vineyard managers must be vigilant for any infected vines, immediately uprooting any vine with the merest whiff of being infected. It certainly appears that South African winemakers are adopting a more proactive attitude against leafroll, rather than accepting it as part of their viticulture. One hopes that on a distant horizon, at least its top producers will be virus free.

The Future

There is the feeling that South Africa's time has come and that the country's wine industry is on the cusp of a golden era that will eclipse everything in the past. Whether that will transpire or not depends upon countless factors. Despite the beginning of a turnaround in perceptions of South African wine (after all, it seems not long ago that UK journalists were queuing up to ridicule Pinotage) the ineluctable truth is that making profit from *vitis vinifera* is difficult. There are constant rumors of wineries furtively seeking buyers, even in Swartland, a region so successful in redefining its image. It will take time to convince consumers, many of whom have been weaned on sub-standard fare in an era when South Africa was overstretching itself to get a toehold within international markets.

"Respected palates rating and writing about South African wine in internationally respected journals have already helped South African wine hugely," remarked Anthony Hamilton Russell. "I am genuinely excited by what is happening at the top end of the industry and this to me is what South Africa should focus on. This message will get out. Sadly, several European markets' initial and most enduring experience of South Africa was as a source of high volume, low cost, well-made basic wine for chains and supermarkets. This is not what we do best - and less and less so versus other countries. The United States, luckily, has always showed more interest in the top end. Volumes of top end wine will grow. South Africa offers a wonderful hint of classicism, which should appeal to the growing numbers of increasingly sophisticated consumers. We must be sure however to place far more emphasis on appellation and matching the right varieties to the right sites. The days of trying to make everything the market wants in the same place are long gone."

South Africa just has to play its strong hand of cards the right way. It will take time for prejudices to dissipate and South Africa must charter a correct course, avoid the pitfalls that others have made, and



address and tackle its deep-bedded problems. It will not be easy, but the rewards are there to be tasted in the glass.

About This Report

I must confess that this was originally intended to be a bridging report limited to just a dozen or so top producers before trooping down to South Africa this winter. As you can see, it did not turn out that way and it somehow snowballed into a far more comprehensive report than I originally intended. I was unable to resist adding just one more and then another. Consider it a bonus. But I have to say, tasting the wines away from their context, without the spellbinding Simonsberg mountains and the luxuriant landscape before my eyes, meant that I could appraise the wines without fear of influence from my surroundings. This hopefully frees up my time when I do venture again to the Cape to conduct more vineyard visits, winemaker interviews and more in-depth articles on regions and/or estates. Most of the 600-odd wines were tasted during a week-long tasting organized with the assistance of "Wine of South Africa" in England, augmented by notes taken at the "Beautifuly South" tasting in London, samples sent to my home and professional tastings organized by the likes of Kanonkop and Klein Constantia. I will also mention Tim James' excellent new book, entitled "Wines of the New South Africa" (University of California Press), which is essential for anyone looking for a historical perspective on South Africa wine, as well as an introduction to the current top producers.
